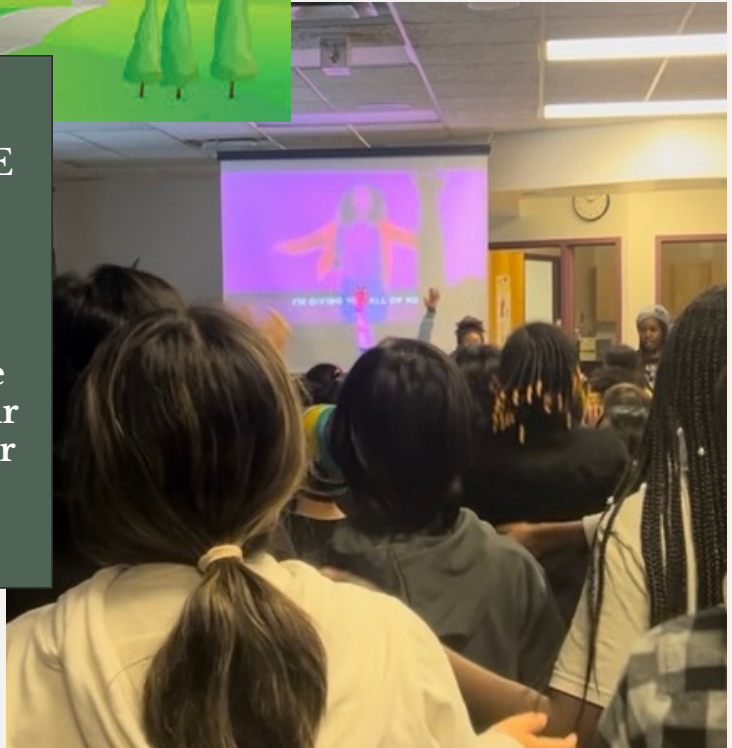

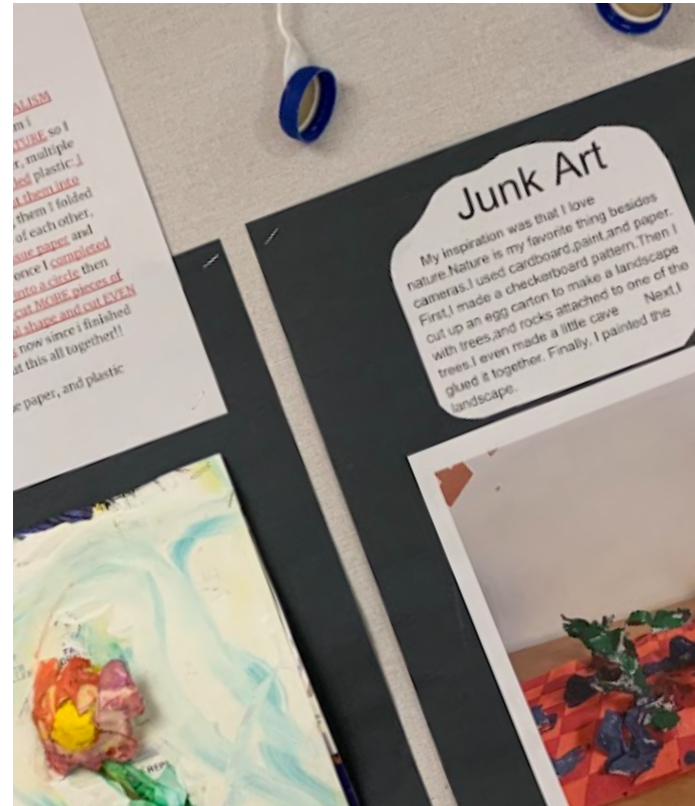

YOUNGSTOWN
