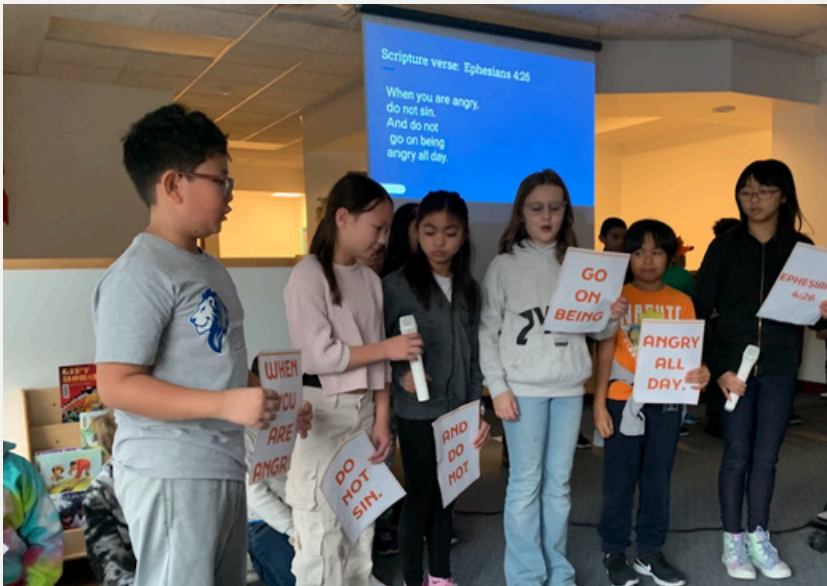
SCHOOL SPOTLIGHT

School Updates



KENSINGTON

Kindergarten continued with their weekly Bible study, prayer, coloring pages, and songs. This month, they focused on the song "Walking with Jesus" and explored the Fruits of the Spirit, engaging in discussions about these important themes.

In Grades 1 and 2, students learned about the story of Elisha and the friendship he formed with a family. The family built a room for Elisha, and in return, he prayed for them to have a child. After the child died, Elisha prayed to God, and the boy was resurrected. The students learned the importance of friendships and praying for one another, and they were challenged to make new friends and help others. A Grade 1 student, for example, helped a Kindergarten student be brave enough to go down the slide. They reflected on Proverbs 17:17: "A friend loves at all times. He is there to help when trouble comes."

In Grade 3/4, students focused on conflict resolution and learning how to be problem solvers. They discussed how, even when upset or angry, they could use different strategies to resolve conflicts and repair hurt feelings. The class also reflected on how to treat others like Jesus would, avoiding prolonged anger.

Grade 5/6 studied various Bible verses about anger, such as Proverbs 15:18 and James 1:20. They discussed how their reactions can affect others and learned healthy ways to cope with intense emotions. They were reminded that God invites us to bring our anger to Him through prayer, so we do not sin.

In Junior High, students connected their learning about big emotions, such as anger, with biblical stories. They explored stories like Moses and the Golden Calf and Jesus cleansing the temple, which offered valuable lessons about managing anger.

HARDISTY

Our chapel was on November 15 and was led by Mr. Dickau. Students were introduced to our new prayer boxes, had some worship time (which the kindergarteners especially enjoyed! They had fun dancing to the songs and learning about our God Guided Emotions). Then Elementary and Jr High split and each group listened to a message (and for the elementary kids, an object lesson!) from a pastor (Thanks to Stephan & Tinisha Reid from The Salvation Army for coming to share with us!).

Grade 3/4 Logos has been digging deeper into what Jesus would do in various situations during our devotional time. We have been happy to rejuvenate the use of our prayer box in our classroom. Some students have been regularly adding prayer requests.

The Junior high students have continued to join together to pray and learn about Jesus and His love for them. During our devotion times, students have studied different characters from The Chosen and compared the characters' situations to their own. Students had a guest speaker in chapel this month who shared with them the importance of not holding on to things, but letting them go.

YOUNGSTOWN

November was a full month at Youngstown. Our Logos classes have been finding various ways to love, serve, and bless others. Many classes filled Operation Christmas Child boxes with gifts for children around the world. Students learned that their mad isn't bad and practiced healthy ways of handling their anger. We had a peace focus and theme throughout the month. Each class was visited by Mrs. Butlin, who is a veteran that served as a Canadian peacekeeper in Bosnia (Sept. 2000-Mar. 2001). She shared her experience and talked about Canada's role with the NATO led multinational peacekeeping force. Students were also taught that anyone can be a peacekeeper - who is someone that solves problems without fighting.

Also this month, a group of Grade 6 Logos Leaders are challenging us as a school to collect toiletry items to make hygiene kits for the Mustard Seed. We continue to have Parents That Pray weekly every Friday morning and our Student Prayer Leaders are continuing to develop and deepen their faith and prayer lives.

BRITANNIA

November seemed to fly by with both a PD day and the November break, but that doesn't mean things haven't been busy over here at Britannia!

We are excited to be working with Youngstown Elementary to assemble hygiene kits for the Mustard Seed. Students have been busy calling and sending emails to local businesses asking for donations. It's impressive to see how quickly their assertive communication skills increased over just a couple classes! We will also be hosting a hygiene items drive at Britannia before assembling the kits on December 18.

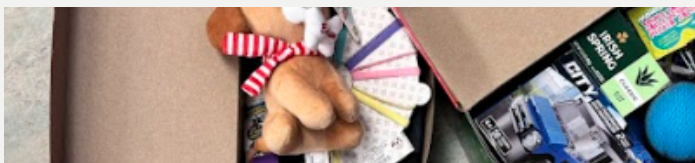
