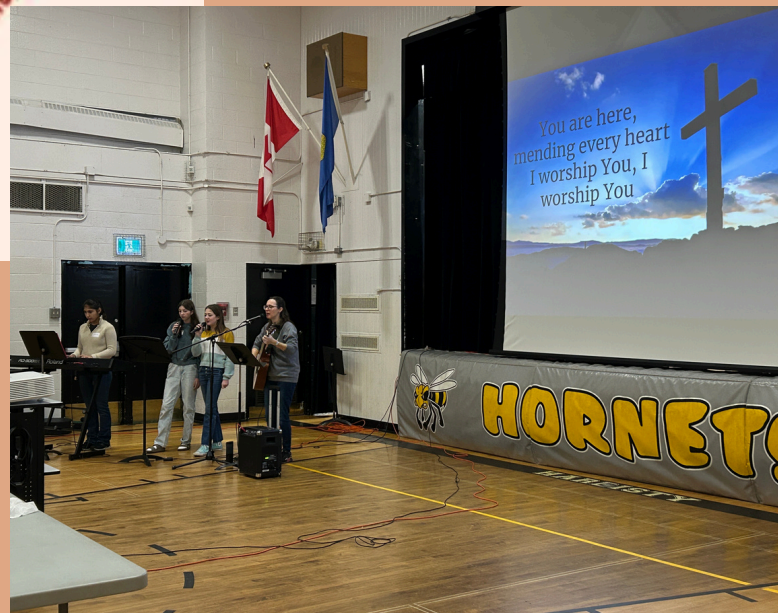

School Updates

YOUNGSTOWN

Despite the deep freeze we experienced, this month went by so fast! Our Logos classes continued to learn and focus on our God Given Emotions: Guilt. In Chapel, students heard about who they are in Christ versus being defined by their own choices or mistakes. We talked about forgiveness and "Being sorry in the way God wants makes a person change their heart and life." 2 Corinthians 7:10 (ICB). Our classes have also been Servant Workers and a light that gives light to the world (Matt. 5:14 ICB) by communicating and creating messages of love, kindness and respect that decorated our main lobby. Our school was a sea of pink on Pink Shirt Day and we were able to come together as one school community with a special assembly.

QUEEN ALEXANDRA

The month of February flew by at Queen Alexandra School as we hosted Student-led Conferences on Feb 13th, the same night as our Open House! Our students were eager to demonstrate their learning to their families. For Valentines Day, our grade 5/6 Logos class baked cookies and our Kindergarten and Gr. 1 French Immersion students decorated them to sell at our school bake sale fundraiser. All money raised from the sale was donated to Kids with Cancer Society. We also celebrated "La semaine de francophonie" (Francophone Week), with the Maple Man visiting our school. Students enjoyed playing many outdoor games in their mixed-grade friendship groups, including eating maple taffy! Our school has been learning about Black History this month through daily announcements, stories and classroom activities. Additionally, the whole school attended a play called Joyful Noise, which shared a variety of cultural stories, folklore, music and games with us as we learned more about Caribbean and Ghanaian culture. Our Faith Friday parables have also highlighted important messages about love and kindness. We have enjoyed sharing God's love with others through our many activities this month!

Our grade 1 class has been reflecting on Mark 1:17 and the call to be 'fishers of men.' We've been discussing how God's grace is for everyone and the importance of extending Christ's invitation to those around us. Through our devotional journals, we've explored ways to care for others and demonstrate God's love in our daily lives. Our goal is to live out our faith by showing kindness, compassion, and grace to everyone we meet.

HARDISTY

A HUGE update: Hardisty Logos officially has some school pastors! Pastors Stefan & Tinisha are Pastors at the Salvation Army Church & will be dropping into each Logos elementary classroom on Tuesdays to teach & chat about Jesus and faith. They'll also be leading Youth Alpha for Grades 6-9 starting in March!

February was a special month for Hardisty Logos as our parents put together a Faith Day for all Logos students! The chapel worship was led by our awesome Jr High worship team and Kristy & Gabe from Kids on Track led the teaching on pride during the chapel. Then students were divided into multi-aged groups and travelled to 3 stations throughout the morning. Here's a peek at the stations:

Sadness: Through a skit, students learned that "Sad isn't bad" and saw that Jesus felt sad, too! They also learned to look for the things we can be grateful for within the sadness and created group gratitude chains that were joined all together at the end of the day.

Loneliness: Students learned to 'flip the script' on thoughts we can have when we're lonely! They watched a skit about "Elijah's 2 Brains" and then spent time creating envelopes out of heart shaped paper and writing notes of encouragement for others.

Worry: Students shared about things that worried them and discussed how we can give our worries to God and He can help us with our worries and give us peace. They tried to guide a leader to pick up signs when blindfolded and then created origami cups & hearts to hold their worries that they wrote down.

KENSINGTON

Grade 1 and 2 have been talking about the life of Jesus. We have discussed how His coming to earth was an example to us of how to live, love, and forgive others. Our memory verse for this month is Philippians 2:3- "When you do things do not let selfishness be your guide. Instead, be humble and give more honour to others than to yourselves." This theme worked perfectly for the month of February where we reflected on Black History Month, Anti-Bullying, Kindness and Love. Grade 3 and 4 discussed love and kindness. We talked about what it means to be kind, like sharing, helping, and saying nice things. We discovered lots of ways to show kindness to our friends and classmates, and how happy it makes us feel when someone is kind to us. We even memorized three special verses that reminded us about God's love and kindness (1 Corinthians 13:4, 1 John 4:19, and John 3:16), that will help us remember to be kind every day.

In Junior High, we've been studying Proverbs and learning how to understand their messages in English Language Arts. We're practicing how to read between the lines, find important lessons, and think about how they apply to our lives. By looking at the different Proverbs, we're also learning how to recognize important themes like wisdom, kindness, and honesty. It's helping us not only with our reading and writing skills but also with making wise choices in our everyday lives.
