KENSINGTON

As the school year wraps up, we've been focusing on how God leads, guides, and directs us—reminding us that He is always with us, no matter where we go.

We shared how God promises never to leave us, even as we head into the fun and freedom of summer break. One summer activity we talked about was swimming—especially when we find ourselves in deep water, which can feel a little scary. This led us to reflect on Isaiah 43:2, a verse that reassures us of God's presence and protection during challenging times: "When you pass through the waters, I will be with you."

To conclude, students wrote about their own "deep hope" for the summer—a personal wish or activity they hope to do or try in the months ahead.

Grade 1&2

In class, we read "A Little Respectful" by Diane Alber. This engaging story helped us introduce and explore the important value of respect. Students learned that respect should be shown to people, places, and things in all areas of their lives. We discussed what it means to be respectful both at home and at school. For example, children demonstrate respect at home by listening to their parents, and at school by listening to their teachers and following classroom rules. Respect also involves taking care of their learning environment by keeping the classroom clean and treating school property with care.

In addition, we emphasized the importance of being responsible with their school supplies—using them properly and ensuring they are not lost or damaged.

To connect this lesson to our faith, we reflected on the following verse:

"Honor your father and your mother, so that you may live long in the land the Lord your God is giving you." Exodus 20:12. This verse reminds us that showing respect begins at home. When we honor and obey our parents, we are living out God's commandment and helping to build a peaceful, loving environment.

By understanding and practicing respect, students help create a positive and supportive atmosphere where everyone can grow and succeed. We encourage you to continue these conversations at home and help reinforce the importance of respect in daily life.

Junior High

Over the past month, students have taken time to reflect on the challenges and changes that often accompany the end of the school year. As exams approached and relationships were tested, we turned to Scripture for both comfort and direction. Through classroom discussions, journaling, and prayer, we explored verses that reminded us of God's constant presence and unfailing love.

SCHOOL SPOTLIGHT



Some of the key passages we focused on included:

- Philippians 4:6–7 "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God... will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

This verse helped ground our conversations about exam stress and uncertainty about what's next.

- Isaiah 41:10 "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God..."

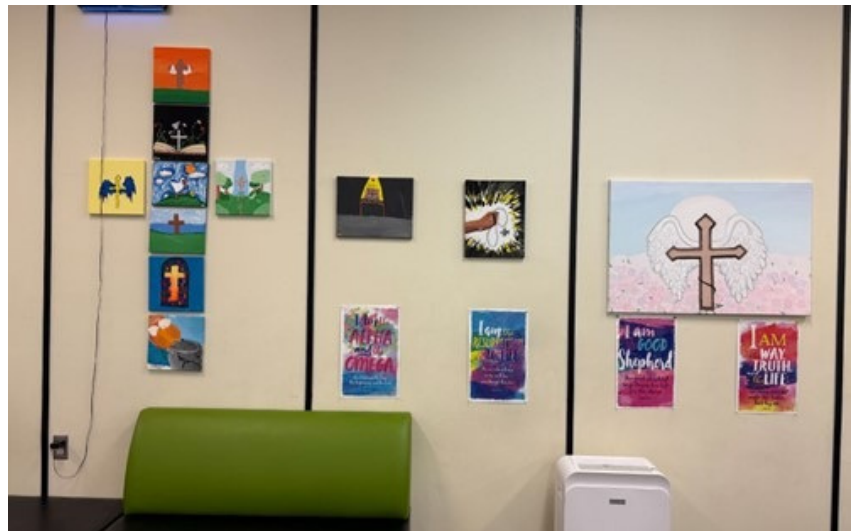
We used this scripture when talking about facing change, whether it's moving to a new grade, leaving a school, or dealing with shifting friendships.

- Romans 12:18 "If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone."

This guided some honest discussions around handling conflict and promoting peace in our relationships.

- Psalm 46:1 "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble."

A source of reassurance when students expressed feeling overwhelmed.



We created space to talk openly about feelings of nervousness, sadness, and even excitement. Students shared what they were looking forward to, what they would miss, and how they could take what they learned this year—both academically and spiritually—into the summer and beyond.

By anchoring ourselves in God's word, we were reminded that even though seasons change, His promises remain steady.

As well, we have finalized our Christian themes art projects and proudly displayed them in the Junior High Learning Commons. They reflect students' creativity and understanding of the themes explored.

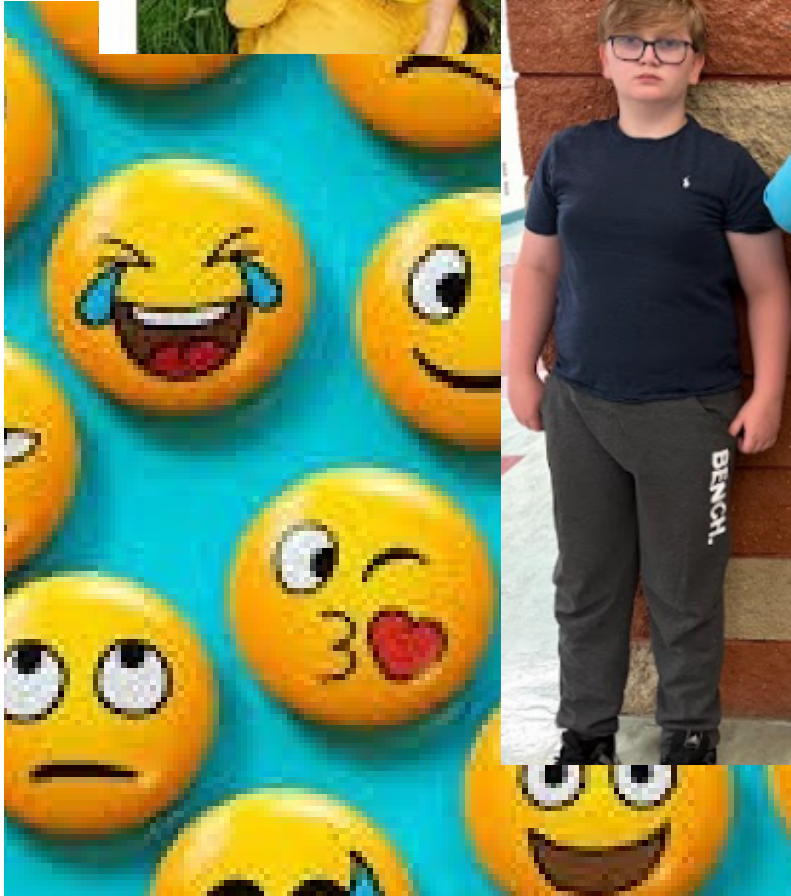

School Updates

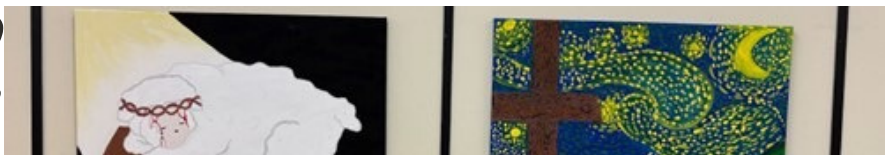
YOUNGSTOWN

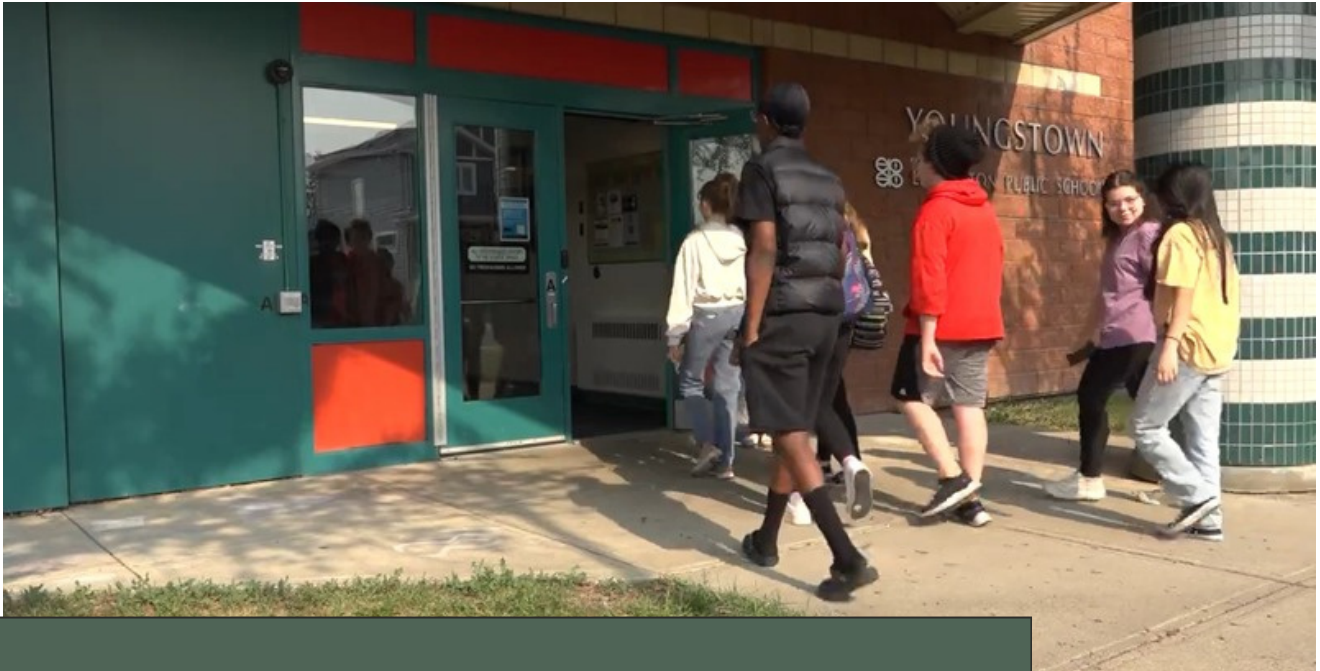
